Location and Parking

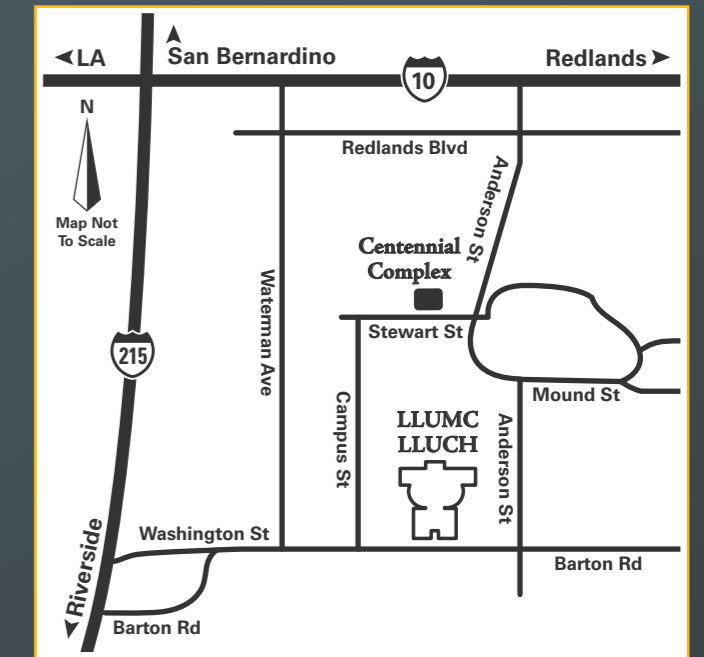
The symposium will be held in the Centennial Complex, Damazo Room, 24760 Stewart Street, Loma Linda, CA 92354.
