
### Focus:

As a Hispanic working mother and assemblymember, Sanchez advocates for the pursuit of education (i.e., every child deserves access to quality education of their parents' choosing, and zip code should not determine opportunity/ providing more choices for school/education), educational reforms to resolve the California public-schools crisis (i.e., fundamentally revamping the education system by creating competition and school choice), parental rights, identifying issues affecting Latinos and developing avenues to empower the Latino Community, supporting underserved communities (i.e., ensuring equal opportunities to work, jobs, and careers), strengthening public safety (i.e., stopping pro-criminal laws, and ensuring D.A.s, law enforcement agencies, and the fire department have the necessary funding and resources to keep communities safe), "Service Above Self" (i.e., being an unwavering voice to represent and fight for Americans), affordable cost of living for all (i.e., with taxes being too high, California must lower the cost of living and help support working class families and small businesses), voicing unconstitutional government abuse and overreach, personal freedoms, and the liberties protected under the U.S. Constitution.

While at the California Policy Center, Sanchez successfully organized and launched the first Children's Business Fair, which brought together young entrepreneurs and community stakeholders from across the state to support future business leaders. During her work along with Reform California, a non-profit taxpayer advocacy group supporting citizen ballot initiatives to hold government accountable, Sanchez fought hard for "Yes on Proposition 6" to repeal state gas tax increases. Additionally, she worked on consequential projects such as TransparentCalifornia.com, a free online resource that provides comprehensive and easily searchable information on the compensation of public employees and retirees in the state of California.
