FY23-24 State Legislative and Budget Priorities



CHC Legislative Priorities CaliforniaHealth+ Advocates Sponsored/Co-Sponsored Legislation

- AB 1549 (Carrillo, W.)
 - Prospective Payment System Reform
- AB 1612 (Pacheco)
 - OSHPD 3
- SB 282 (Eggman)
 - Same Day Access
- AB 85 (Weber)
 - Social Determinants of Health

CHC Legislative Priority: AB 1549 Prospective Payment System Reform

AB 1549 (W. Carillo) would include additional triggering events to WIC 14132.100 to truly capture wage increases stemming from state or local efforts, CHC actual costs of services, and expanded care team members in a CHCs PPS rate.

- Location: Assembly Appropriations Committee
- CHC ASK: In order to continue providing excellent, high-quality care to patients in our communities, our PPS statute must be modernized to help CHCs successfully meet the state-mandated care transformation efforts. Support the bill when it comes before the you in committee or on the Floor.

CHC Legislative Priority: AB 1612

Removing Licensing Barriers for Providing Access to Care

AB 1612 (Pacheco) would update the construction and building standards for outpatient clients and would provide that a Primary Care Clinic in good standing would be able to acquire and operate an existing outpatient setting or building a new outpatient clinic without being linked to the heightened building standards of a hospital clinic.

- Location: Assembly Appropriations Committee
- CHC ASK: Current heightened standards result in barriers to access patient care because community health centers are required to utilize their funds for construction costs that don't substantially improve patient safety rather than expanding services or opening additional sites in underserved areas. Support the bill when it comes before the you in committee or on the Floor.

CHC Legislative Priority: SB 282

Same Day Access to Medical and Behavioral Health Care

SB 282 (Eggman) would allow FQHCs and RHCs to bill Medi-Cal for two visits if patients were provided mental health services on the same day, they have a medical visit.

- Location: Senate Appropriation Suspense File
- CHC ASK: California is one of 15 states that DOES NOT allow community health centers to receive reimbursement for providing medical and behavioral health care on the same day.
 Urge the Budget Chairperson pass the bill out of suspense.

CHC Legislative Priority: AB 85 Social Determinates of Health Screenings

AB 85 (Weber) would require health plans and insurers to include coverage for SDOH screenings, referrals, and community navigation services

- Location: Assembly Appropriations Committee
- CHC ASK: AB 85 seeks to improve health outcomes for vulnerable communities and supports the state's efforts to achieve whole person care. <u>Support the bill when it comes</u> <u>before the you in committee or on the Floor.</u>

CHC Legislative Priorities

CaliforniaHealth+ Advocates Opposed Legislation

• SB 525 (Durazo)

– Minimum wage: health care workers

• SB 779 (Stern)

Increasing reporting requirements for CHCs

Opposition: SB 525

\$25 Minimum Wage for Health Care Workers

SB 525 (Durazo) would establish a \$25 per hour minimum wage for all healthcare workers and would require exempt employees to make double the minimum wage.

- Location: Senate Appropriations Committee
- CHC ASK: Our health centers support higher wages for their employees, but any effort to increase wages must be sustainable, equitable, an applicable to all centers. <u>Vote NO in</u> <u>committee or on the floor unless it's amended to provide a</u> <u>funding source and provide CHCs the statutory and</u> <u>regulatory changes necessary for successful implementation.</u>



Clinic Data Expansion

SB 779 (Stern) seeks to dramatically expand the amount of data reporting requirements on CHCs focusing on 6 major categories: PPS rate, revenue spent on workforce, mergers and acquistions, detailed labor report, workforce development, and quality/equity.

 CHC ASK: The bill is overly broad, duplicative in many areas, and an unnecessary expansion of data reporting requirements.
Vote NO in committee or on the floor unless it's amended to remove all duplicative reporting requirements and lessen administrative burdens.

CHC Top Budget Priorities

Budget Ask: Increase Medi-Cal Health Enrollment Navigators Project with \$60M one-time funding request (\$30M state/\$30M Fed Match)

Culturally and linguistically appropriate health navigation services must be funded!

CHC Top Budget Priority: Health Navigation Funding Expansion

Between now and June 2024, 15.2M current Medi-Cal beneficiaries will undergo program recertification, and 700,000+ individuals will become newly eligible for full-scope Medi-Cal benefits through the Health4All adult expansion. Culturally and linguistically appropriate health navigation in a patient's trusted medical home must be funded and prioritized in these efforts. CHCs are ideally positioned to do this.

• CHC ASK: It is critically important that the state commit an additional, one-time \$60M to increase Medi-Cal Health Enrollment Navigators Project funding. <u>Please sign on to the budget letter</u> <u>supporting this critical funding request.</u>

Tips for Talking with Policymakers

- Get to Know Your Legislators
 - Review their biography
 - Understand their priorities and what committees they're on
 - Review social media accounts
- Meetings
 - Coordinate a meeting place and time with your group
 - Designate a meeting "facilitator"
 - Tell your community health center story
 - Elevate patient stories
 - Show your passion
 - MAKE THE ASK!
 - Follow-up with digital informative & identifying information
 - Thank legislator/staff and post on social media if you take photo
